Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021, begins the Holy Season of Lent. The Hamilton Diocesan Office for Evangelization and Catechesis and the Diocesan Office for Liturgy have prepared an Ash Wednesday program that can be celebrated at home – with the Gospel proclamation and a brief reflection by His Excellency, Bishop Douglas Crosby.

Parents may bless their children by tracing the Sign of the Cross on their foreheads, marking the beginning of the annual Lenten journey. In addition to the liturgy, a resource sheet for families encourages a prayerful observance of this Holy Season. Pandemic restrictions may still curtail our local, in person traditional services. But that doesn't mean skipping Lenten practices. Here's an excellent program for your daily participation right in your own home.

This Lent, we invite you to journey with Dr. Tim Gray by signing up for **Daily Lenten Reflections**. Each day you will receive in your inbox a short video which features Dr. Gray commenting on the

daily Mass readings, explaining the Scriptures, and providing you with concrete ideas on how to apply them to your life. This free service comes from the Augustine Institute which aims to help Catholics understand, live, and share their faith.



President of the Augustine Institute, Tim Gray is a well known Catholic speaker and author. He received an MA from Franciscan University of Steubenville, ThM from Duke University, and PhD in Biblical Studies from Catholic University of America. Under Dr. Gray's leadership, the Augustine Institute has created popular programs including Symbolon, a comprehensive program of faith formation for adults, FORMED, a digital platform with Catholic film, ebooks, and audio talks, and Signs of Grace, a sacramental preparation program for children. He is the author of several books including Peter: Keys to Following Jesus and Praying Scripture for a Change: An Introduction to Lectio Divina.

Catholic Guidelines Outline For Your Lenten Observance

The divine law binds all the Christian faithful to do penance each in his or her own way. In order for all to be united among themselves by some common observance of penance, however, penitential days are prescribed on which the Christian faithful devote themselves in a special way to prayer, perform works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by observing **fast and abstinence**, according to these canons. (Canon 1249)

The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent. (Canon 1250)

Abstinence from eating meat or some other food according to the prescripts of the conference of bishops is to be observed on every Friday of the year unless a Friday occurs on a day listed as a solemnity. (Canon 1251)

*Abstinence and fasting, however, are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting in the Latin Church is the limitation of food and drink – typically to one main meal and two smaller meals, with no solid foods in between.

*The law of abstinence binds those who are 14 years of age and older. The law of fasting, however, binds all those who are 18 to 59 years of age. Nevertheless, pastors of souls and parents are to take care that minors not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are also educated in a genuine sense of penance. (Canon 1252)

***The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops decrees that the days of fast and abstinence in Canada are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fridays are days of abstinence but Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day.**
