Ontario Lockdown Update St. Dominic Masses Continue Capacity Reduced to 15%

As Ontario's COVID-19 cases continue to rise, a declaration of emergency and provincewide stayat-home order was put in effect April 8. The impacts of current lockdown measures will be evaluated after 28 days to determine if it is safe to lift the restrictions or if they need to be extended.

Under ONTARIO REGULATION 11/21, section 3 religious gatherings are allowed and residents of Ontario may leave their homes to attend religious gatherings. "Attending a gathering for the purpose of a wedding, a funeral or a religious service, rite or ceremony that is permitted under the Stage 1 Order. Therefore within the Diocese of Hamilton, religious services, weddings and funerals are allowed but are restricted to:

- ➤ Indoors: 15% capacity of the room.
- ➤ Outside: the number of people that can keep two metres physical distance from each other.
- ➤ This does not apply to receptions, which have different capacity limits.
- ➤ Previous guidelines on cleaning and disinfecting stay in place.

Mass at St. Dominic

For St. Dominic Parish, our current schedule of Masses will continue but attendance will be restricted to 15% of the capacity of the room. First arriving parishioners will be seated in the church. When 15% capacity is reached, arrivals will be seated in the Parish Auditorium, Narthex, Chapel and the Balcony. NOTE: Persons seated in the auditorium can view the Mass on a large TV in that room. Speakers have been added to the Chapel to allow those seated there to hear the Mass.

At all church doors, usher/greeters will track arrivals as well as take contact names, number in the party and telephone numbers. To assure you are seated in the main church, *arrive early!*. Late-comers will undoubtedly be directed to alternative seating.

All meeting and event spaces at St. Dominic remain closed. So, no meetings this week.

Brian Thornton




