### Volunteer Profile – Brenda Downey

Creatively talented, Brenda embodies an energetic East Coast cheerfulness and tireless exuberance that are blessings to our parish.



### "Januarys"

Where did all this creativity originate? Years ago. Brenda and her sister Linda made Christmas tree ornaments as a fun project. Always on the hunt for new ideas, the humble Christmas Tree Ornament project grew to include Christmas home decorations.

Having researched wholesalers and discovered such a 'winter wonderland' of beautiful supplies, the creative juices really started to flow and in 1999 the duo established a company called "Januarys", a nod to their joint birthday month.

Their first show found them armed with armloads of glittery supplies, glue guns and tons of enthusiasm; they worked until all hours of the day and night, preparing for what was to become an annual Christmas Craft Show spanning more than 20 years. Word quickly spread. They began receiving requests to decorate homes for the Christmas season. A call came asking them to decorate a house for a Christmas Tour in Nova Scotia. Always up for a challenge, they packed the car to the roof (*no one can pack a car like Brenda*) and took the show on the road.

Soon requests started coming in to decorate for weddings in Ontario, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, a family reunion, a 50<sup>th</sup> High School Reunion, and for an Ordination dinner centerpiece. "Januarys" branched out further than either of sister could have imagined.

Fr. Charlie Jordan (a great supporter of "Januarys" from Mary Mother of God Parish, where Linda worked, unknowingly put "Januarys" on the catering scene. He asked Brenda and Linda to prepare lunches for the Bishop and visiting priests during confirmations, missions etc. It goes without saying that the tables were always beautifully decorated and the meals delectable and elegantly presented. Naturally, word got out that "Januarys" now catered! Brenda took on the enormous task of catering her nephew's wedding reception with great gusto and did a fabulous job. So, to add to their repertoire, "Januarys" began catering and decorating for anniversaries, birthdays, wedding breakfasts, reunions and for just about any other cause for celebration.

After moving to Oakville, Brenda volunteered to lend her skills to the decorating committee at St. Dominic Parish, a role she took on with much love and enthusiasm. Her ideas and design talents are second to none as is evident in all the stunning Christmas, Easter and Thanksgiving decorating in our church over the years. She has put her

heart and soul into this job and takes much pride and dedication in what she does.

#### **Volunteer Screening Liaison**

In addition to lending her decorating and culinary skills, Brenda also is St. Dominic's Screening Liaison. i.e. she manages diocesan mandated forms, police checks and documents required of volunteers who apply for certain ministries.



A native of Halifax, NS, **Brenda Downey** is the eldest of five girls, She grew up in a close-knit family, a tie that continues to this day with sisters Linda, Ann Louise, Catherine and Terri..

During her teen years in Dartmouth, she worked part-time at Zellers and was involved with a parish teen social club. Even then Brenda's creative genes prompted her to begin decorating for the dances. She participated in school plays, church choir and the annual St. Patrick's Variety Show.

While working at the Royal Bank in Dartmouth, Brenda met the love of her life, Earl Downey, another RBC employee. With all of her sisters in her bridal party, Brenda and Earl married September 3, 1966, at St. Paul's Church, Dartmouth. They began their married life in Amherst, NS but were transferred to Newfoundland in 1969. While there, they had two daughters, Jill and Danette, and lived in Kelligrews, Stephenville and Placentia. In 1975, it was back to Dartmouth until they moved to Oakville in 1977. Brenda and Earl were both avid gardeners. On Sundays, they loved nothing better than to jump in the car, drive down country roads undaunted at the prospect of getting lost. They saw their outings as an adventure and a day of discovery.
