Farewell (for now) to Harris Family

In July, St Dominic
Parish will bid farewell to
Ewert and Sheron
Harris who have been
actively involved in St.
Dominic Parish for the
past nine years. The
Harris family along with
their two children, then
ages 2 and 3 moved to
Canada in July 2001 from
Jamaica. Initially they



lived in Ajax where they were members of St. Francis De' Sales Parish until they moved to Oakville.

That move, like their current departure to Portsmouth, NH, was prompted by Sheron changing jobs from 3M to Medtornic of Canada. Their current move to New Hampshire also is a consequence of Sheron's employer Laborie, where she is a Manager of Supplier Quality. When Laborie, a medical device manufacturer, moved their Canadian operation to Portsmouth, they asked Sheron to come. This is a lifetime or career contract for Sheron, however, Ewert and Sheron are hoping to be able to retire within five years and return to this area. Ewert says, "We are not selling our home. Our children, Matthew and Gabrielle will continue to live there when they are not at the University of Ottawa where they are students."

Prior to the pandemic, Ewert and Sheron were Seniors Ministers leading Sunday services for residents at OSCR. Ewert is among our more frequent Lectors at both Sunday and weekday Masses. He also was a member of the Friday Morning Men's Scripture Group, served as Sacristan for the 11 a.m. Mass and helped with ushering during the pandemic services.

For the past four years, Ewert has also been a member of our R.C.I.A. team leading catechumens to full communion with our faith. For almost 20 years, Ewert has been a member of the Knights of Columbus, however his membership is with St. Gabriel's in Burlington. He is now a Fourth degree Knight and as such is a member of the Pope John Paul II Assembly in Burlington.

Four years ago, Ewert joined the Hamilton Diocese Deaconate program. This includes an initial formation period followed by four years of continued study. He has just completed year three and unfortunately, will have to put his Deaconate formation on hold for the time he is away. When he returns to Canada, he will be allowed to resume the program and hopefully complete the final year or so. He said there is a possibility he may be able to pick things up in Portsmouth but that remains another bridge to cross. Ewert asks all the parishioners to pray for him as he continues this discernment and for the Lord to give him clarity as to how "He wants me to serve".

In farewell, Ewert leaves us this message: "I really love St. Dominic's and I have developed a lot of relationships and friendships with several parishioners as well as the wider community of Oakville. I was looking forward to serving in the community once I was retired so, hopefully, I will

be back soon. I have to apologize to Deacon Terry as he was looking forward to training and getting me to join him in his prison ministry."
