A warm welcome to Saint Dominic Parish! The children in grade 2 and the older ones, who missed it, are invited to enter into a special and loving relationship with Jesus, our risen Lord, through the celebration of the sacraments of First Reconciliation (Confession) and First Holy Communion (Eucharist). 5 WAYS TO PREPARE FOR FIRST COMMUNION

- 1 HELP YOUR CHILD UNDERSTAND AND PARTICIPATE IN THE MASS**

Encourage your child to pay attention to the Mass and pray the prayers along with you.
- 2 EXPLORE WITH YOUR CHILD WHAT SCRIPTURE TEACHES US ABOUT THE EUCHARIST**

The Eucharist is foreshadowed in the Old Testament, and is made explicit in the Gospels and epistles of the New Testament. Here are a few passages:

 - Genesis 14:18-20 - Melchizedek's Offering
 - Exodus 16 - Manna from Heaven
 - John 6:22-59 - Jesus Giving of Himself
 - Matthew 26:17-30 - Jesus Celebrates Passover
- 3 SPEND TIME IN FAMILY PRAYER**

- 4 EXPLAIN THE EUCHARIST IN TERMS THAT ARE EASY FOR A CHILD TO UNDERSTAND**

 - The "spiritual food" they will receive through the offering of bread and wine. Just as food nourishes the body, Jesus nourishes our soul through the Eucharist.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who may receive Holy Communion?

Any baptized Catholic in grade 2 (or older), who has been properly prepared, and who desires to receive the Lord in this sacrament.

What do I need to register?

1. Completed Registration Form
2. A copy of your child's Catholic Baptismal Certificate (*Even if baptized at St. Dominic Parish*)
3. Enrollment Form (*to be submitted at a scheduled enrollment mass*)

What is expected of parents?

Parents are expected to worship with their child at Mass each Sunday. Also, please make an effort to spend some time weekly with your child to go through their study materials. Parents are the first and the best educators in faith.

My child is not enrolled in an HCDSB School?
