The parable of two sons is specifically directed to the Pharisees and Sadducees who claimed hegemony on God's Kingdom. Because of their Biblical traditions, Hebrews boasted of being chosen by God. Many a time, God referred to them as His first born, but the Hebrews believed that they were the only 'child of God' (Ex 4.22).

Matthew wrote this parable 50 years after the death and resurrection of Christ. At that time, the Christian communities were predominantly made up of pagans. 


