
Banquets in scripture symbolize joy and happiness in God's kingdom.

The reality around us looks scary; there is economic insecurity, moral degradation, broken family systems, monotonous religious living, threats of wars, natural disasters, pandemics and many more things that threaten not only our normal living but also our very existence.

The feast of God's kingdom is begun; the invitations are being sent to all - to every tribe, tongue, and nation. But it waits for everybody to come in and secure their place. No one can accept the invitation and enter the feast unprepared.


