This week's liturgy invites us to pay attention to our human frailty and specifically our The Gospel of Mathew was written around mortality. Death is a part of human life – we are all born to die. I often meet people on the verge of their death. Because of this lance to the wedding banquet of heaven. belief, there arose some practical problems. Many stopped working and spent time praying and preparing for Parousia. The second problem was more theological - what will happen to those who have already died and gone before? For Paul, when Jesus comes in Glory, the dead will have already been raised

to new life. So, Paul emphasizes our need to prepare for the day of the Lord's coming without neglecting any responsibilities in this world for our neighbours and for ourselves.


