"Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and opened" (Mk 7:34).

The actions and the words that Jesus uses while performing the miracle in today's gospel are quite unusual for Him. He takes the man who is dumb and deaf to a lonely place, puts His finger in his ears, applies saliva to his tongue, looks up to heaven in prayer, and uses a mysterious word. They give a somewhat mystic, ritualist and magical feel to the raise people's hope to see things clearly. whole action of performing this miracle. Most of the time, Jesus commands or touches the people and healing takes place.
