

### 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time **Servant Songs**

In Isaiah, chapters 40 to 55, we find seven songs/poems ascribed to a mysterious figure called the 'Servant'.

servant' is a bit vague. He is identified as this servant for their salvation, and to teach Jacob – the nation of Israel, and as an individual who has a mission to the whole na- totally different from how we humans see. tion.

In the fifth song, the servant speaks about his mission as that of one who 'gathers Israel for him' and whose job is to bring salvation to all the nations (Is 49).

The sixth and the seventh songs speak about the persecution, death and vindication of the servant. In the sixth song, the servant does not shy away from insults and persecutions. "I gave my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard" (50:6). He was subjected to shame In today's Gospel, Jesus identifies himself and spitting.

The seventh song is our first reading today (but only a small part is read at the Mass). He is shown as a mysterious figure distinct from the nation, who has lost all his beauty and is despised by others. He has taken up all the transgressions and the iniquities of the people and paid it with his suffering. "My

servant shall justify many, and he shall bear their iniquities" (53:11).

If someone reads these servant songs, one may feel that the author was witnessing the suffering and death of Jesus. But these songs were written some 600 years before Jesus' In the first four songs, the identity of 'the birth. God had foreseen the need to send all His ways. The way God sees His servant is Through human failures, the servant of God achieves his success. His success is not counted by his achievements, but how many he saves. He saves his own persecutors from their iniquities.

> The servant is the perfect image of Jesus who, though hated and persecuted like the servant - saved people by humbly accepting His suffering. He gave up His life as a sacrifice that the whole of humanity might find fullness of life in God.

> with the Old Testament prophecy of the servant. Jesus said, "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mk 10:45). These are the similar words spoken about the servant in Isaiah; "By his suffering shall my servant justify many" (Is 53: 11). -
