SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SAINT DOMINIC/ST. ANDREW CONFERENCE 40TH ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the 40th Anniversary of St. Dominic/St, Andrew Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. In 1982, a number of parishioners from St. Dominic Parish saw a need in our community. This was during the recession of 1982 and families were experiencing hardships from loss of jobs and bankruptcies. Under the guidance of Fr. Steven Bodner, the pastor at that time, the Sparrow Group was formed. "Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap, nor gather into barns: yet our heavenly Father feeds them" (Matthew 6:26). The Sparrow Group was active for approximately one year and realized it was involved in helping the less fortunate people in our community in much the same way as members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul Conference in Hamilton. Gerry Farrell, a Vincentian from one of the Hamilton Conferences, was invited to a Sparrow Group meeting and gave an outline on how to organize a conference. At the next Sparrow meeting, the decision was made to form a conference. The first meeting of the St. Dominic Conference was held on October 11, 1984. At that time there were no other conferences in Oakville. SSVP assisted families from all of Oakville and occasionally Milton. Some of the members of St. Dominic Conference were St. Andrew Parishioners and a few years later, the conference became St. Dominic/St. Andrew Conference. Over the past years, other Catholic churches have formed conferences. There are now 5 other conferences in Oakville.
